Between 2010 and 2018 Prof Giles was Program 3 Leader in the Deep Exploration Technologies CRC and part of a multidisciplinary R&D team responsible for introducing Coiled Tubing drilling with attendant in-field sampling and sensing technology to the mineral exploration industry. He is Chief Scientific Officer of MinEx CRC where he manages a portfolio of mineral exploration research projects in collaboration with resource companies, METS companies, government organisations and research providers.
