

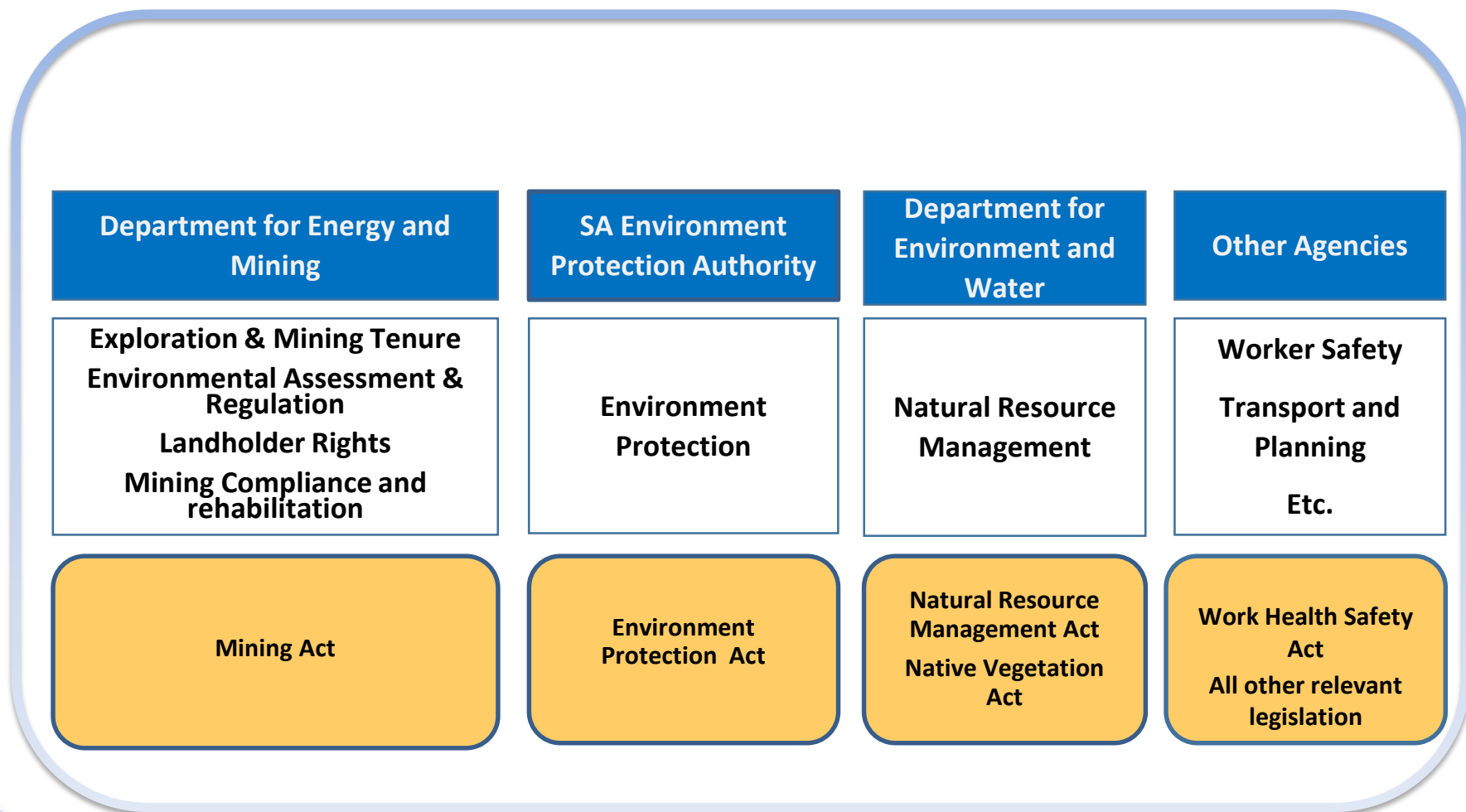

Public Consultation Process

Notice of the consultation period was published in:

- the *South Australian Government Gazette*
- *The Advertiser*
- *The Courier (Mount Barker)*
- *The Adelaide Hills Weekender Herald*
- *Southern Argus (Strathalbyn)*
- *The Times (Victor Harbor)*

and on the Department for Energy and Mining website, inviting members of the public to make submissions on the applications from:

11 July 2019 until 20 September 2019.



Things to consider before making a submission

Privacy

If you wish for your personal information to be withheld from your submission you must:

- request that your name and contact details be withheld from publishing
- **not include** personal or identifying information in your submission, headers, footers or attachments.

Submissions including offensive, threatening, defamatory or other inappropriate material will not be accepted.

Commenting on the Applications

Consider the following:

- Has any aspect not been included or inadequately or incorrectly described?
- Have all potential impacts been identified?
- Is the proposed level of proposed impact on the environment (the 'environmental outcomes') appropriate?



Public Consultation – Next Steps

Public submissions and Government request for information provided to Terramin with a request for response. The submissions and Government information request will be made public on DEM's website.



Terramin reviews all submissions and responds to relevant matters by providing a Response Document to DEM.



Government assesses the information provided in the Response Document. If relevant matters have not been adequately addressed further information may be requested.



Assessment Process

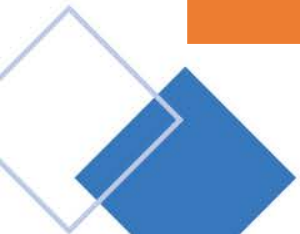
Government completes a comprehensive technical assessment of the applications taking into account the Mining Proposal, Management Plan, submissions received and Terramin's response.



The Minister for Energy and Mining (or Delegate) will then make decisions on the applications. The decisions must consider submissions received from the public.



The Minister may refuse or approve the applications. The outcome of these decisions will be published and communicated to all relevant landholders and people who made a submission.
