Subject: Bird In Hand Mine Proposal

To the State Government and relevant departments.

I am e-mailing you today to give you a general idea of my concerns over the proposed Terramin mining proposal in Woodside. I am a resident living on Bird In Hand Rd. This is only 200 metres from the proposed mine boundary.

On a personal level, I have some concerns. The property I live on has cattle and a large garden of fruits and veg that relies on underground bore water. With the risks associated with the managed aquifer recharge system I am very concerned about the quality of the water being injected into the system. I am also concerned about the amount of heavy trucks that will be using the roads in the surrounding areas. In the past month alone I have seen the aftermath of a number of accidents in this area involving smaller vehicles. I fear what would happen if trucks were involved.

Living so close, I am also concerned about the noise from blasting twice a day with drilling and truck noises will not effect me living so close. Not to mention the amount of dust that will be produced. This doesn't seem like conditions conducive to taking my 2 year old niece with asthma and a number of allergies out in the backyard to play anymore.

Broadly speaking, whenever I tell people where I live their response is always based around how beautiful this area of the Adelaide Hills is. There are well renowned wineries in the area that regularly pull in bucket loads of tourists and even locals. This area being mined does not fit in with this idea of the "beautiful, spacious" Adelaide Hills at all. It seems impossible that it will not turn away a large number of tourists in the area. I can't imagine the frustration that some of the business owners in the area feel.

The proposed Terramin mine is totally at odds with what the Adelaide Hills in known for. It is going to negatively impact so many locals in the area. So I implore you, the South Australian Government—stop the project from going ahead.
