Hi there,

I am writing to oppose the proposed Bird in Hand gold mine at Woodside.

I work in Woodside and have two small children who regularly come and play in the local area.

I am concerned that Terramin's proposal to blast underground twice per day will have a drastic affect on the area, the pristine surrounds, the tourism numbers and of course the families and businesses in the local area.

The Adelaide Hills attracts 1.4 million visitors every year thanks to its pristine landscape and world class wineries. If damage to water supply kills local farms and wineries, the resulting dip in tourism will have huge consequences for the 744 tourism-based businesses in the area (South Australian Tourism Commission).

24 heavy trucks per day on fragile country roads will drastically increase wear and increase safety issues at the already congested (and known blackspot) Nairne/Woodside intersection. This increased risk to safety is unacceptable and is just one of the reasons why the mine should not be allowed to proceed.

Please consider the future of environment for our children and the local economy before a mine that is a short term project.
