RE: Hillside Submission (Rex Minerals)

I write to your department to highlight some inaccuracies regarding Rex Mineral's proposal to mine at Hillside. My main concern is **Hydrology**.

- Rex Minerals have as I believe tested / drilled to 50 metres. I believe that they intend to mine to up to 450 metres in depth.
 - How can a Department make a conclusive decision when all the facts are not available?
 A model has been produced, I believe. A model does not take into account what is under the 400 metres not drilled or tested other than what information that is available to the existing 50 metre drill results. The water table cannot be controlled adequately & is irreversible should a mistake be made.


