¹ **Myall Park** – has been named after the Western Myall tree, which is native to arid areas of central and Western Australia. The weeping form of the species that grows at Roxby Downs, South Australia bears the common name water myall. It is one of the largest trees in the Roxby Downs area. It grows to approximately 8 metres in height and has a shady umbrella like crown. It's yellow flowers only appear after heavy rainfall. The wood is dark brown, hard and durable and was historically used by the Aboriginal people for foraging. The Western Myall is a long-lived plant whose life span has been estimated at 600-1000 years.
