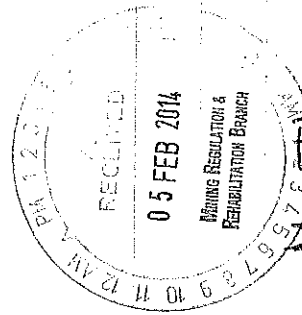

4/ The increase of traffic movement in and around our country village. Again causing possible chance of accidents with children walking to and fro from school. This village is growing, with several tourist drawcards now operating, after major investments by the owners. Will people still want to visit here with a noisy, dusty mine operating so close by.

Finally, on a personal note, my husband and I bought our land in 1988 building our home and moving here in 1994. We are retired people in our late Sixties and Seventies and love our little village. It is pretty, friendly and importantly tranquil. It is very important to us to try to maintain this perfect lifestyle and
