Dear Sir/Madam

We are viticulturalists operating within 500 meters of the proposed Bird in Hand mine at Woodside S,A.

As you are aware this is valuable prime agricultural land suitable for intensive agriculture in addition to livestock.

Our major source income is from the sale of grapes and we rely on underground water taken through bores for irrigation to supplement any rainfall.

Mining and dewatering of the mine are hand in hand operations.

Changing the water status of the area will affect the quality and quantity of underground water such that it may become unsuitable for irrigation.

This is not in our best interests and would threaten our livelihood.

We consider this puts the project in "too risky basket" and urge you "stop the start" of mining at Woodside.
