

I wish to lodge my objection to the proposed Hillside Mine that Rex Minerals are putting forward for the following reasons,

- As the mine is going to be dug so deep there is going to be a problem with salty ground water coming into the mine each day so what will be done with this contaminated water?

- Where will the workers be coming from? Will they be renting houses in the towns thus again taking away from tourists and chances of new comers joining our towns?


