This is an updated version from the earlier one I sent through after the date was extended until today. I would imagine, if we had a longer time-frame & more media coverage that this petition would have many more signatures.

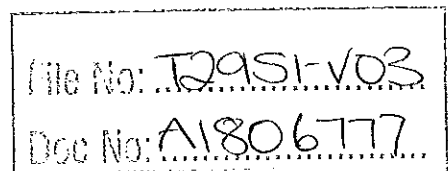
I request that you take this petition into consideration when assessing the Rex Mineral Proposal.
