I am writing in relation your application made under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* (the FOI Act) seeking access to the following:

A copy of any briefings, memorandums, emails and other documents relating to Amendment 1 - Request for Proposal extension to Submission close date for Tender Code DEM052571.

In accordance with Premier and Cabinet Circular PC045, if you are given access to documents as a result of this FOI application, details of your application, and the documents to which access is given, may be published in the agency's disclosure log. A copy of PC045 can be found at <a href="http://dpc.sa.gov.au/what-we-do/services-for-government/premier-and-cabinet-circulars">http://dpc.sa.gov.au/what-we-do/services-for-government/premier-and-cabinet-circulars</a>.

A search has been conducted and five (5) documents were discovered that fall within the scope of your application. The documents are identified in the attached schedule. In respect of the documents, I have determined that they can be released as follows:

## Document 1

I have determined that this document should be released in part.

The parts to which I have not granted you access are the names and email addresses of third parties, and the mobile telephone numbers of employees. In addition, I have not granted you access to information relating to the business affairs of third parties.

Under Clause 6(1) of Schedule 1 to the FOI Act, a document is an exempt document if its disclosure would involve the 'unreasonable disclosure of information concerning the personal affairs of any person'. This information falls within the definition of personal affairs under the FOI Act and is therefore exempt from release pursuant to Clause 6(1).

Under Clause 7(1)(c) of Schedule 1 to the FOI Act a document is an exempt document if it consists of information concerning the business, professional, commercial or financial affairs of any agency or any other person. This document contains information concerning the business affairs of a private companies, the disclosure of which could reasonably be expected to have an adverse effect on those affairs.



In considering the grounds for exemption under Clause 7(1)(c), I have considered the public interest for and against disclosure.

I acknowledge the strong public interest in fulfilling the objects of the FOI Act, including promoting openness and accountability within government agencies. Other factors in favour of disclosure include enabling effective oversight of government expenditure and providing applicants with documents of special interest to them.

Factors weighing against disclosure include the public interest in protecting the commercial and business affairs of third parties. The document contains information relating to third-party organisations who are interested in submitting a proposal to a current Request for proposal (RfP) process, the outcome of which will be important to the future profits of these businesses. The disclosure of the information could reasonably be expected to have an adverse effect on the business affairs of these third parties, serving to reduce their business advantage in a competitive field, weakening future tendering processes and negotiating positions with future clients.

I have also considered the public interest in ensuring the effective conduct of the department's functions and the need for some confidentiality to allow the department to operate efficiently. Release of the information relating to a process that is currently underway is likely to prejudice this process, as well as future proposals and forthcoming procurement. Release could prejudice the future supply of such information to the agency if these third parties aren't assured of confidentiality. Disclosure of the information may also provide unfair advantages to some businesses in this and future tender processes.

On balance, I have determined that it is contrary to the public interest to release the information that has been redacted under Clause 7(1)(c).

# **Document 2**

I have determined that this document should be released in part.

The part to which I have not granted you access is the mobile telephone number of an employee.

Under Clause 6(1) of Schedule 1 to the FOI Act, a document is an exempt document if its disclosure would involve the 'unreasonable disclosure of information concerning the personal affairs of any person'. This information falls within the definition of personal affairs under the FOI Act and is therefore exempt from release pursuant to Clause 6(1).

I have determined that these documents should be released in full.

## **Document 4**

I have determined that this document should be released in part.

Information contained within this document, that is not relevant to your application, has been redacted and marked as "Out of scope".

# **Exemptions**

For your information, the following exemptions apply:

# Clause 6 – Documents affecting personal affairs

(1) A document is an exempt document if it contains matter the disclosure of which would involve the unreasonable disclosure of information concerning the personal affairs of any person (living or dead).

# Clause 7 – Documents affecting business affairs

- (1) A document is an exempt document
  - (c) If it contains matter -
    - (i) consisting of information (other than trade secrets or information referred to in paragraph (b)) concerning the business, professional, commercial or financial affairs of any agency or any other person; and
    - (ii) the disclosure of which -
      - (A) could reasonably be expected to have an adverse effect on those affairs or to prejudice the future supply of such information to the Government or to an agency; and
      - (B) would, on balance, be contrary to the public interest.

#### **BACKGROUND**

- The Office of Hydrogen Power SA (OHPSA) has developed a Request for Proposal (RFP) which seeks industry partners to help deliver the Hydrogen Jobs Plan by December 2025.
- The RFP was released to the global market via the SA Tenders and Contracts website on Friday, 16 December 2022.
- International interest in the project is high, with more than 200 parties engaging in the RFP process since it opened.
