Additional comments

After attending the Community meeting held on August 19 at the Woodside Institute, it is very clear that this mine should NOT go ahead. The concerns raised at this meeting far outweigh the positives and should be heavily considered.

Why upset a majority of the Adelaide Hills, to keep Terramin happy ? Why risk the Tourism that the Adelaide Hills brings into the economy? Why put lots of local businesses at risk to benefit Terramin ? Why create 100 jobs over 5 years when the Wine industry creates a whole lot more for generations to come?

I beg that you don't just look at the facts, but look at the experience and recommendations made by those close to the mine. Its easy to sit behind a desk and try understand the impact on the region, but without speaking with local residents about how this mine could ruin their business, ruin their livelihood and dramatically impact their home values, leaving them in financial stress.
